Day of Service at Aspire

As the co-chair of the IFMA NI Community Services Community, I am pleased to announce that the annual Day of Service will be held on Saturday, September 10th from 8:00 AM to noon at Aspire. We will be helping at a few of the group homes with routine maintenance activities: landscaping, painting, cleaning garages, repairing small items throughout the homes.

As a facilities manager, I realize most of us don't have the traditional 40 hour work week. Believe me, I've been awakened many times during my career in the middle of the night or worked way passed quitting time. So, I know that asking you to volunteer a few hours on a Saturday morning when you have your own lists of "honey-do's" or other family activities is a sacrifice. However, let me tell you a little bit about Aspire, and why giving a few hours of your time, is a worthy investment.

Aspire was founded in the 1960s to provide services to children and adults with developmental disabilities and their families throughout the Chicago area. Currently, they serve approximately 585 children and 320 adults each year. The group homes, where our volunteer efforts will be focused, are part of Aspire Living. Aspire Living teaches, encourages and supports independence and includes life skills enrichment, including job training, community homes and independent living—to empower adults with disabilities to reach new and rewarding levels of independence.

Most importantly, they do not receive any type of state aid, so volunteers, and donations, are critical to their operation. Also, you'll have fun and get to know your fellow IFMA NI members a little better. And if you are looking for a quality activity for your family, spouses and children are welcome, too. Just please, no small children.

We'll follow up our work activities with lunch at the main facility, where the staff will give tours of their recently renovated space.

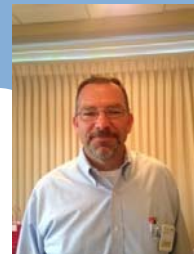

Tips for Preventing Corrosion

Corrosion is the deterioration of metals due to oxidizing. Most commonly this is seen as rust. The key to proper corrosion care is stopping it before it starts. With metal corrosion, it is true that an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

How Corrosion Happens

Corrosion can happen to any metal. Most frequently you will be dealing with corrosion on iron - that is, rust. In order for a metal to begin to corrode, it needs three elements: moisture, metal, and an electron acceptor. An electron acceptor is an element (usually oxygen) that steals electrons from the metal, which is what happening on a molecular level when a metal corrodes.

When water comes into contact with iron, a chemical reaction immediately begins to take place that quickly oxidizes the iron, turning the iron into iron-oxide (the chemical name for rust). While iron is the most reactive metal and therefore will corrode faster than most others, all metals are susceptible to this process.



How to Prevent Corrosion

We already know that in order for corrosion to take place we need metal, moisture and an electron acceptor (usually oxygen). In order to prevent corrosion, we simply need to remove one of these three components from the equation.

The simplest component to remove is the metal surface. This can be done by coating the metal being used with paint or enamel. This prevents the metal from being exposed to oxygen, thus preventing corrosion.

Galvanizing is the process by which a metal, like iron, is coated with another metal, such as zinc. This coating of what is called a "sacrificial metal" protects the underlying metal from the factors that cause corrosion. The sacrificial metal then corrodes instead, leaving the unexposed metal intact. The galvanizing agent (the sacrificial metal) should last for a long time if done correctly; however, it will eventually corrode away, leaving the original metal again exposed and in need of a fresh galvanized coat.

Corrosion Protection in Your Facility

Many of the tools, machines and accessories in your facility are likely made of metal, therefore susceptible to corrosion. A few small changes can help reduce the likelihood of seeing corrosion in your shop, thus preserving your equipment and saving your organization money.

1. Seal Your Tools

As we know, one of the components for corrosion is moisture. Opting to keep your tools in a sealed, plastic [tool chest](#) can help keep them from moist conditions on the floor of your plant. Also try adding a [moisture absorbent](#) to help keep the chest conditions as dry as possible.

Corrosion Continued

2. Dehumidify

Keeping a humid environment increases the moisture in the air and could set your tools up to encounter corrosive elements. If your shop runs on the humid side, try installing a [dehumidifier](#) to make for a less rust-friendly environment. This is especially helpful if you have large, metal equipment that cannot be moved or sealed.

3. Use a Corrosion Inhibitor

Galvanizing has been made easy with the availability of cold [corrosion inhibitors](#). It is applied like a paint, but has all the same protection as heated galvanizing performed on galvanized products before they leave their manufacturing plants.

4. Keep It Clean

Having an excess of dust can accelerate the corrosion process in your facility. This is because dusts absorb water. The more dust particles that settle on your equipment, the more water that could come into contact with their metal surfaces and promote corrosion. Be sure to clean your items regularly to prevent dust-activated corrosion.

The Bottom Line

Corrosion is an inescapable truth for anyone using metal. But knowing how it happens is the key to running interference on rust. Exposed surfaces are vulnerable, so treat them if you can. Reducing or eliminating water and moisture will greatly impact the likelihood for corrosion to occur and slow it down to a manageable, preventable pace.

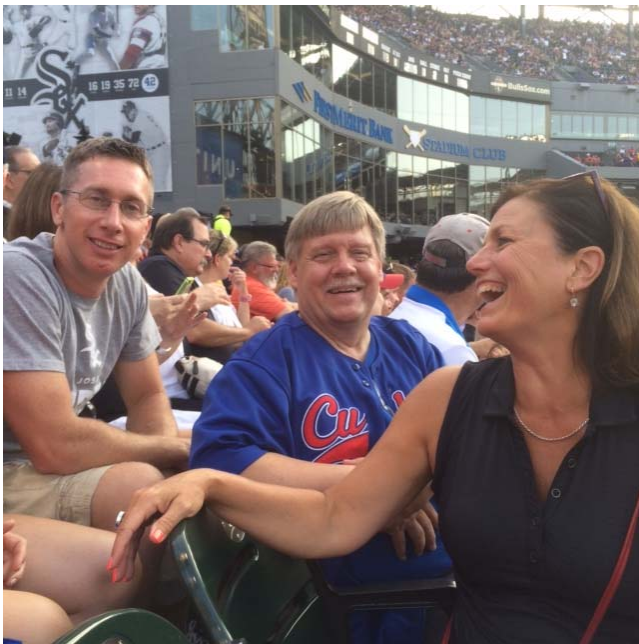

Assistant Property Manager, Industrial

Job Description Summary

Under the supervision of the Property Manager, the Assistant Property Manager is responsible for assisting in all areas defined as a part of the Property Manager job description

This is a management role that will directly and indirectly supervise individuals, building staff, operations, and coordinate the various functions. Primary responsibilities include ensuring client facilities generate a satisfactory cash flow, the property is maintained in accordance with client standards and requirements, and customer satisfaction

Job Description

KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE

Bachelor's degree; CPM and/or RPA candidate preferred

A minimum of 3 years working in real estate with property management experience preferred

Working knowledge and experience in financial accounting in commercial real estate, financial reporting and budgeting necessary

Ability to read, interpret and fully understand leases, storage rental agreements, and related documents; must be able to abstract a lease and storage rental agreement terms, conditions and modifications into the Cushman & Wakefield accounting system

Hands-on familiarity with tenant improvement construction projects; ability to plan, organize and coordinate multiple projects, ability to read and understand construction specifications and blueprints

Strong literacy in MS Word and Excel

Highly organized and skilled with time management

Excellent written and oral communication skills

Strong customer service/tenant relation skill required

PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Assistant Property Manager should be capable of managing the building staff/community in the absence of the General Manager or Property Manager. This includes being able to perform all managerial functions which are included in the General Manager's or Property Manager's job description, or as directed by the General manager or Property Manager

If there is more than one Assistant Property Manager at a site, the GM or Property Manager will designate the Assistant Property Manager who will be in charge of the property in the GM or Property Manager's absence

Potential duties are as follows and are dependent on the type, size, and complexity of the building (s) managed.

General Duties

Responsible for all building correspondence to and from owners, tenants, vendors and management

Responsible for invoicing including receipt and processing for payment according to established procedures, including verification of appropriate back-up, coding and vouchering After approval by the GM, PM and/or Director, forward invoices to accounting for processing

Maintain building office files

Produce and monitor purchase orders for non-contract materials or services ordered

Handle rent collections by assuring collection of all rent on time and assess late fees on collections received after consulting with GM or PM

Create and update Lease Summaries for each tenant

Coordinate all tenant move-ins and move-outs including furniture deliveries and pick-ups

Handle all tenant requests for special work Obtain estimate, provide proposal, order work, and invoice

Assistant Property Manager, Industrial

tenant for such work

Maintain work order system Enter, print and distribute Service Requests, follow-up with staff or vendor to ensure completion, invoice billable work

Create, print and distribute quarterly building newsletter

Assist GM or Property Manager with the preparation and dissemination of monthly client and building reporting

Maintain Tenant Information database

Update and maintain all office procedures in Operating Procedures Manual

Update Certificate of Insurance lists for tenants, vendors and moving companies Request new or renewed certificates as required

Maintain "Critical Dates" report which lists all tenant anniversaries, lease expirations, options, rent increase dates, etc

Maintain report of electrical charges on a building-wide and floor-by-floor basis

Financial

Assist with preparation of annual operating budgets and reports for the facility

Assist with preparation of monthly financial reports

Assist with preparation of annual operating expense reconciliations

Tenant Relations

Responsible for day-to-day tenant calls

Coordinate all tenant events

Coordinate tenant anniversary and holiday gift program

Coordinate Fire/Life Safety Procedures training for tenants

Handle move-in of tenants Provide Welcome Package, keys, coordinate move

Custodial Supervision

May oversee work by custodial service or crew

Coordinate all special projects handled by custodial crew

Relay complaints, problems, special cleaning projects, etc to custodial lead

Conduct weekly inspections with custodial Supervisor

Security Supervision

May oversee security staff through review of Incident Reports, communication with Site Supervisor and Account Manager

May assist security staff with special needs (ie forms, memos)

May assist in annual review and revision of security Post Orders

Tenant Improvement/Alterations Supervision

May oversee tenant improvement work and alterations to building tenant spaces

Coordinate access to building for contractors

With GM or Property Manager, conduct final walk-through and punch list on new construction and alterations Follow up on completion of punch list items

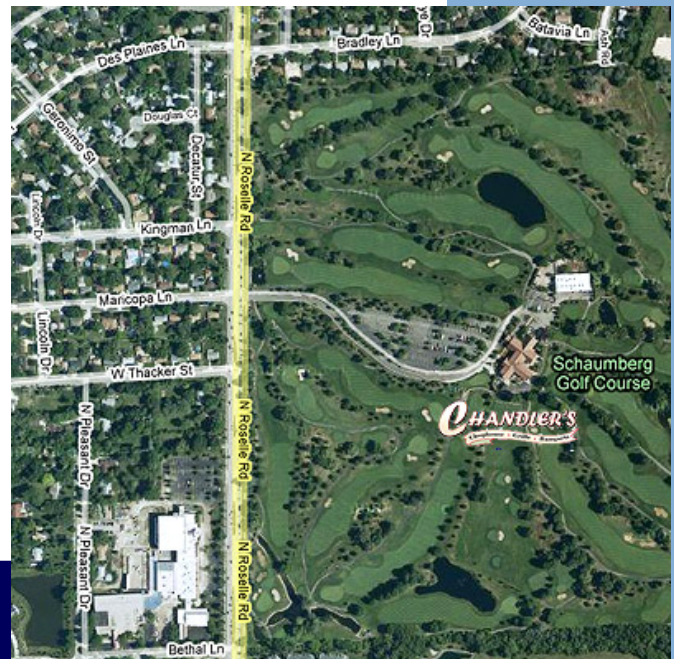
